Sarah Rosales is a Salvadoran American coloratura soprano from Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Opera career highlights include covering the role of Isabella Stewart Gardner in the world premiere of Damien Geter's American Apollo (Des Moines Metro Opera), Lauretta/Nan (Gianni Schicchi/American Gothical, Cedar Rapids Opera), Belle (Beauty & the Beast, Des Moines Metro Opera's Opera Iowa Program). Upcoming appearances include a role debut at The Glimmerglass Festival as Alícia in the world premiere of Derek Bermel & Sandra Cisneros' opera The House on Mango Street, as well as appearing in the ensemble of

Stravinsky's The Rake's Progress.

In addition to opera, Sarah frequently performs musical theater, pop, & cumbia music through concert and cabaret work. She is the recipient of numerous vocal awards including 2nd prize in the John Alexander National Vocal Competition hosted by Opera Mississippi, 1st prize in the Bruce P. Carlson Scholarship Competition hosted by The Schubert Club, winner in the Shirley Rabb Winston Scholarship hosted by National Society of Arts & Letters, the Nerenberg Award in the Musicians Club of Women Vocal Competition, 2nd prize in the Edvard Grieg Society of Minnesota Vocal Competition, and 2nd prize/commission award in The George Shirley Vocal Competition. Most recently she was awarded 3rd place in the upper Midwest regionals of The Metropolitan Opera Laffont Competition. In her free time, she loves to tend to her garden, cooking for friends and family, and spending time with her Irish Wolfhound mix dog, Miss Juniper Belle.

The Martorella Scholarship is in remembrance of my opera-loving grandfather. When I was a tiny child, he had me sit on his lap as he listened to the Metropolitan Opera radio program on Saturday afternoons. Who knew that I would start to sing at age nine, become a soloist in church, have leads in musical theatre and operas. My Papa was very proud of me! Now, I am pleased to be able to honor the memory of Bernardo Salvatore "Benny" Martorella by funding this scholarship to help young talented opera singers in his name!

National Chair Martorella Scholarship in Classical Voice

This scholarship is available through the National Society of Arts and Letters to classical singers ages 23-31. Applicants must demonstrate exceptional talent and promise of future success. The scholarship funds are for private study, special training, or personal advancement in the applicant's future career. The funds may be used for college tuition, but not for housing, travel, or personal expenses. Scholarship funds are sent to the institution, teacher or program selected by the scholarship recipient. Recipients have 15 months to use their scholarships.

By participating in the Martorella Scholarship in Classical Voice you consent to your name, image, and likeness being listed on NSAL website and other materials including advertising, fundraising, and promotional purposes, without payment or additional compensation unless prohibited by law.

ELIGIBILITY

The applicant must:

- 1. Send proof of United States Citizenship, Naturalization or Permanent Residency.
- 2. Be at least 23 years old, but not older than 31 by March 1, 2026.
- 3. Applicants may only enter one chapter competition.

REPERTOIRE and APPLICATION

- 1. Prepare a current, high-quality video of three (3) vocal selections from opera, oratorio, and art song. All 3 categories must be represented. Repertoire must be sung in three languages, one of which must be English. Each of the songs must be contrasting in style, key, and mood. Aria and oratorio must be in original key and language. Oratorio may be sung from score, others to be sung from memory.
- 2. Selections may not be edited, and the audio may not be enhanced. The singer should be clearly visible. Do not submit a recording of a prior performance. Any audience should not be visible and absolutely no applause should be heard.
- Upload the video to YouTube. Identify yourself by name only and introduce your song titles
 and composers. Please submit ONE link to all three performances. Total video time must not exceed 12 minutes.
- 4. Complete *(print or type)* the application form. Be clear about your commitment to a vocal career. Specify your plans for further study, e.g., advanced degree, private study or other special training.
- 5. Please include a current headshot and performance photograph.
- 6. Email all materials to the NSAL Chapter nearest your current residence by February 15, 2026. Include the completed application form, citizenship document and URL link to your YouTube video. See Chapter Contacts for phone numbers, and emails.

CHAPTER ADJUDICATION

 Qualified judges from each NSAL chapter will select a maximum of <u>2</u> performers from the YouTube auditions.

DEADLINES

- 1. Contestant applications are due to chapters by February 15, 2026.
- 2. Chapters must email only 2 finalists' applications and YouTube audition information to the National Committee Chair before the deadline of March 10, 2026.
- 3. Martorella Voice Scholarship recipients will be announced in April 2026.
